

Caregivers Conference

We are excited to offer a new program this year focusing on the relationship between cancer survivors and their primary caregivers. Within the supportive environment of Camp Mak-A-Dream, and with professional guidance, adult cancer survivors and their primary caregivers will share experiences and resources, develop skills and ultimately work toward the common goal of fostering better communication and understanding within their relationships.

The conference will include facilitated workshops and group discussions focusing on topics such as communication, finding and utilizing resources and self-care. One-on-one sessions with professionals will be available to address more specific issues. Participants will also have the opportunity to enjoy recreational

What Camp Means to Me

About 14 years ago, I attended Camp Mak-A-Dream. I first attended the Women's Retreat and then the Young Adult Camp. I was in the middle of treatment for Hodgkin's Lymphoma, in which I was a stage 4 and undergoing chemotherapy and radiation. I came to camp as a very bald, skinny, scared 19-year-old who had no idea what the future might hold for me.

What I found at Camp Mak-A-Dream was a haven where I didn't have to explain why I was scared, why I felt so fundamentally different than the rest of my peers and what being a 'survivor' really means. I found a place where I could feel scared, happy, sad, overwhelmed, joyous and adventurous — all in the same moment — and I didn't have to be "strong" all the time. It gave me the right to embrace the new identity that had been thrust upon me — for good or bad.

My husband and I are currently in a position where we can afford to make a monthly donation in hopes that other young people will be able to have an experience at camp like I did.

I have not had a recurrence of cancer, and have now been married for 12 years with three children. They are my miracles and I thank God every day for the life that has sustained me and for the people who helped me through one of the most difficult journeys of my life.

Please let me know if there is anything else I can possibly do to help camp.

Imagine you've been diagnosed with a life-threatening illness. Imagine all the scary words and treatment details that are thrown at you when the only word your mind keeps repeating is "cancer." Imagine you've never heard of these side effects, these medicines, or even the name of the cancer with which you've just been diagnosed. Imagine how scary this is. Imagine how lonely this is.

For 17 years, we at Camp Mak-A-Dream have made the cancer experience just a little less scary and just a little less lonely. In the peaceful surroundings of Gold Creek, Montana, we are able to continue prescribed cancer therapy, to give necessary blood transfusions, to give IV antibiotics and to maintain labs. But this is all done in the background. What we do in the foreground is provide an environment where those affected by cancer can talk openly — to share experiences and to laugh and to feel just like everyone else around them. Individuals may arrive as scared cancer patients and leave empowered as a part of a unified, close-knit community.

The word "community" conveys the essence of our programs and of our mission. More than 5,300 people have benefited from our programs and been a part of the physical community of Camp. This has only been possible because of the community of thousands of volunteers and donors who have contributed to Camp Mak-A-Dream since 1995. You should be proud to be a part of our Camp Mak-A-Dream community. Please share this pride with your friends, family, neighbors and colleagues. The larger our donor and volunteer community becomes, the more intimate community-based programs we can provide.




