TOURING THE LODGE

If you can not make it out to Gold Creek, let us take you through the camp's center of activity, the lodge. This 11,000 square foot beauty is sided with cedar shakes and pine beams. Tastefully decorated in a traditional Montana ranch theme, forest greens and various woods bring the outdoors in. The lodge is fully accessible with an elevator on the northwest corner of the building. On the main level you'll find the dining room which can accommodate 130 people. The floor is tongue and groove pine, and you'll find a wall of windows from top to bottom on the north side of the building. From this vantage is a spectacular view of the Pintlar Mountains and the Clark Fork River Valley that you won't soon forget. And, for those chilly Montana nights, a field stone fireplace will warm even the coldest of toes. A sound system and stage completes the setting. The kitchen is a chef's dream with the most modern equipment available. Meeting rooms are also available on the main floor for retreats and other special events. To enjoy the outdoors, a deck and patio surrounds the front of the building with views of the swimming pool, mountains, and huge hot tub. On the lower level you'll find more meeting rooms, an exercise area, laundry and the biggest bathrooms you've ever seen. A multi-purpose room is underneath the dining room. Come take a tour sometime! 
CORPORATE HIGHLIGHT CYBEX CORPORATION






CAMP OFFICE MOVES TO A NEW LOCATION


